GitHub Copilot

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✓ Pros

- Autocompletes code, functions, snippets
- Supports multiple LLMs (GPT-4, Claude, Gemini)
- Natural-language prompts

⚠ Cons

- ~43% accuracy (Python), 57% after 10 attempts
- Subscription-based (paid)

- Enterprise setup complexity

- Limited public pricing info
- Performance details unclear

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✓ Pros

- Good Sourcegraph ecosystem integration

⚠️ Cons

- May require Sourcegraph
- Less common standalone

- Native to Visual Studio
- Enterprise-grade support

⚠️ Cons

- Limited broader capabilities
- Language flexibility unclear

- Covers entire SDLC
- Code generation, testing, reviews
- RAG-based context

⚠ Cons

- Newer tool
- Adoption and stability unknown

 Tool	 Pros	 Cons
 Cline (Roo)	Reads project, can plan + execute tasks	Early-stage, requires setup
 OpenHands	Modify code, browse web, fetch StackOverflow	Not polished yet
 Aider	CLI-based, works across files	CLI learning curve
 Goose	Agent framework, filesystem-level AI coding	Self-hosted complexity

 Tool	 Pros	 Cons
 Continue.dev	Custom AI assistants; multi-IDE	Setup/config complexity
 Codeium (Windsurf)	Free, privacy-first, 70+ languages	Not fully open-source
 Open-source LLMs	Flexibility, cost-effective, local run	Needs ML integration effort
